- Demonstrate a knowledge of the history of Argentina and Puerto Rico as presented in readings, songs, films and internet resources
- Expand the variety of writing samples to include longer personal essays, research papers, and formal and informal letters related to the issues of human rights, identity and the environment using grammar and vocabulary appropriate to an advanced intermediate level
