DEMONSTRATES KNOWLEDGE OF CONTENT AND CONCEPTS

Plant and Animal Parts

- Use materials to design a solution to a human problem by mimicking how plants and/or animals use their external parts to help them survive, grow, and meet their needs.
- Obtain information to compare ways in which the behavior of different animal parents and their offspring help the
 offspring to survive.
- Use information from observations (first-hand and from media) to identify similarities and differences among individual plants or animals of the same kind.

Light and Sound

- Plan and conduct investigations to provide evidence that vibrating materials can make sound and that sound can make materials vibrate.
- Plan and conduct an investigation to determine the effect of placing objects made with different materials in the path of a beam of light.
- Use tools and materials to design and build a device that uses light or sound to solve the problem of communicating over a distance.

Sky Patterns

- Use observations of the sun, moon, and stars to describe that each appears to rise in one part of the sky, appears to move across the sky, and appears to set.
- Analyze provided data to identify relationships among seasonal patterns of change, including relative sunrise and sunset time changes, seasonal temperature and rainfall or snowfall patterns, and seasonal changes to the environment.

- Read or listen to stories about famous Americans of different ethnic groups, faiths, and historical periods and describe their qualities or distinctive traits.
- Explain that Americans have a variety of different religions, celebrations, and customs and describe those held by members of the class and their families.

- Identify temporal sequences such as days, weeks, months, years, and seasons. Use words and phrases related to time and changing historical periods.
- o Place events in students' own lives in chronological order.
- o Read dates on a calendar and associate them with days of the week.
- Describe a map as a representation of space, such as the classroom, the school, the neighborhood, town, city, state, country, or world.
- o Identify cardinal directions and apply them to maps, locations in the classroom, school, playground, and community.
- o Define and locate the North Pole, the South Pole, and the equator.
- o Define and give examples of a continent, mountain, river, lake, and ocean.

Civics and Government

o Give examples to show the meaning of the following words; politeness, achievement, courage, honesty, and reliability.

Economics

- Give examples of products that people buy and use.
- Give examples of services that people do for each other.
- o Give examples of the choices people have to make about the goods and services they buy.
