Keeping Chromebooks Safe from Damage

We have had an increased need for loaner Chromebooks and would like your help in keeping your child's Chromebook safe. Please remind your child about the following:

- **Chromebooks and water do not mix–if a water bottle leaks in a backpack, it will cause damage.
- **Chromebooks need to be held carefully–dropping it may cause the screen to crack.
- **Chromebooks should be stored in a safe place to protect them from heat/cold and weather.
- **Chromebooks should be kept in their cases at all times.
- **Chromebooks should be plugged in each night and stored in a safe place at home.
- **Chromebook chargers should be left at home.

You may remember the 'Tide Pod Challenge' a few years ago and the 'Bathroom Challenge' last year where school bathrooms were destroyed. There is currently a 'One Chip Challenge' that involves eating a particular chip (Paqui is an example) that is extremely hot and can cause the need for medical attention. We wanted to bring this to your attention so that you are aware of it and can speak with your child about the dangers of this type of behavior.
