Upcoming MGH Survey - Week of February 7

Stony Brook 7th and 8th graders will participate in a survey sponsored by Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard Medical School. All students will complete a very brief one-time survey about substance use, mental health, and experiences at school, which will take place during the week of February 7th. During the survey, your child will be asked about a variety of different things. For example:

- **Basic demographics (e.g., age, race, ethnicity, sex, gender identity)
- **Mental health (e.g., symptoms of depression, anxiety, emotion dysregulation)
- **Substance use (e.g., lifetime and current use of alcohol, marijuana, and nicotine)
- **Other descriptives used to create a unique code (i.e., it cannot be used to identify a student) for all completed surveys (e.g., eye color, first three letters of their street name in 5th grade, middle

initial).

**Students will have the option to provide contact information if they are interested in hearing about any of the other voluntary and confidential clinical research projects we offer through our Center at MGH. If your student completes the survey and would like to hear more about our other programs, we will provide you with more details on the projects available, give you the opportunity to ask any questions you have, and will require your written consent if your student is under the age of 18 before they are enrolled.

Please send in your child's physical and immunization records as you take them for physicals. We require up to date physicals and immunization records **prior** to their 7th grade year. Physicals dated September 1, 2022 or after are acceptable. Required immunizations for 7th grade are the Tdap and Menactra.
