- 1. Approved November 2022 minutes unanimously
- 2. Reviewed and clarified ideas for feedback on 4 priority areas of Westford's Strategic District Improvement Plan

<u>Focus on 4th goal</u>: Collaborate with Town partners to support goals specifically outlined in the Westford's Climate Roadmap authored by the Clean Energy and Sustainability Co.

- Information about the environment club founded by students at SB: the goal is to measure and decrease the ecological footprint of the school (recycling and composting practices involved)
- Idea from Bill Harmon <a href="mainth-@gmail.com">harmanwh@gmail.com</a>, community member about using the woods as a conservation land behind the school and get the students involved
- Discussion about resource person regarding composting: Sharon Chew member of the Westford Agricultural Commission schew@westfordma.gov
- Ideas from Mindy Schnare about integrating 6th graders through a project in finding solutions to reach net zero at SB: document <u>Stony Brook's map to net zero by 2050</u>; some elements discussed:
  - the 2 unused solar panels that may contribute to feed charging stations
  - MASSAVE visit
  - Bring awareness through the project of the plastic bag in order to visualize non recyclable/reusable trash for a day
  - Compost produced by the school could be used for the greenhouse
  - Establishing compost from food trash from students lunches;
     Tom Hinkle shared a document from his school where students started to look for solutions to integrating composting practices (practices start at a small scale, info shared with the whole school to educate all students)
  - Addressing plastic silverware issue: use of real silverware to dishwash, wooden silverware, recycle plastic silverware, students could bring their own silverware
  - Car traffic and idling issue lines of cars that are running at drop off and pick up: change practices and establishing walking pathways to school rather than car drop off
  - Looking for how other schools reduce their footprint (from New England and Europe where organization around lunches is different).

- Karen will reach out to Sharon Chew regarding sharing resources about composting.
