March 1st: PS portal opens after school!! Students review recommendations and enter their elective choices. **Portal closes at 2pm on March 8th!**


March 1st: Override link is available after school. Closes at 2pm on March 8th!

Below are the directions for completing the Course Request Process for the 2024-2025 school year. Please read these directions thoroughly.

For complete instructions on this process: Download Step by Step Guide to Scheduling Process.

The course selection process is an individual matter of concern for you and your parent(s)/guardian(s). Students must select a minimum of 32.5 credits (30 credits minimum for our seniors). Please review the course descriptions in the Program of Studies. Current teacher recommendations are an integral part of the course selection process. However, the most important part of this process is YOU. Take

Please note all prerequisites and grade level requirements. You will not be scheduled for a class for which you do not meet the prerequisites.

Please select between 32.5 and 35 credits. Seniors select between 30 and 35 credits.


- Please enter an alternate choice for each elective in the event that we are unable to schedule you for your first choice elective.
- Same applies to PE! You need to choose your top choice PE course and an alternate. Reminder: You can't repeat a PE course! PS won't allow you to register for a PE course that you've taken.
- Please take your time and make the best decisions you can for yourself.




How to select your classes


Step 1 – Review the Program of Study to read course descriptions and graduation requirements

Step 2 – Log in to Powerschool (https://westford.powerschool.com/public) on your chromebook or laptop from March 1st–March 8th.




Step 3 – Click on the "Class Registration" button on the left side of the screen






Step 4 – Click the Pencil Icon on the right side of the screen under each subject to see your recommendation and/or select the courses you would like to take (for courses that require a recommendation, you can *only* select the course that was recommended for you.)




For an override (to request a change in level up): follow the steps below for completing a request for an override but you MUST select the course that you were recommended for.

If the override is approved, those will be manually entered by each curriculum coordinator.

Override Process

- Trust the recommendations that are in the system.
- Have conversations with your teachers!
- Limitations in place. Please follow our <u>OVERRIDE POLICY & PROCESS</u> for details of the process.
- The form will be available available on 3/1
- You must submit the Google Form by MARCH 8, 2024 at 2 pm. There are NO EXCEPTIONS to this deadline.

Override FAQs

Q: If I am is filling out an override form, what do I do in PowerSchool?

A: Your should mark what was recommended for them EVEN if they plan on overriding. After the portal has closed, the override note will be added to PS if it is approved.

Q: If I am recommended for honors, can I request CP instead? Does that require an override?

A: Yes, they can choose CP instead. No, that is not an override.

A: How will I know if my override was denied?

Q: You would receive an email from the curriculum coordinator if the request was denied.

Override FAQs

Q: How many overrides am I allowed to submit?

A: Two.

Q: If I wind up getting the average needed for a class and therefore don't need the override I originally submitted, can I use that override for another subject?

A: No. Overrides cannot be transferred.

Q: If I am not within the five points to override, but am close/hope to be by the end of Q3, should I submit an override?

A: Yes, because you would still need the override to be considered for the class.

Override FAQs

Q: If I have submitted an override and fall below the five points needed to override by the end of Q3, am I still eligible to take the class?

A: No. Overrides are only valid for students who are within five points of the prerequisite grade.

Q: In order to take AP Psychology from a CP course, do I have to submit an override even with the prerequisite grade?

A: Yes. Students in CP History must have *both* a 95 average and submit an override to take AP Psychology.

Q: Can I override into an AP science class if I am currently enrolled in a CP science class?

A: No. Please refer to the Program of Studies.

Q: Who do I go to if I have questions about my recommendations?

A: Your teachers

Q: Is there a limit to how many honors courses a student can take?

A: We do not limit the number of honors courses.

Q: How much homework can students anticipate nightly?


